Om Namo Shakyamuni, Namo = Saluting you, Homage to... "Shakyamuni" = epithete for the Buddha. Buddhaya, Dhammaya, Sanghaya Om Namo Shakyamuni, It means "sage of the Shākyas," Shākya Buddhaya, Dhammaya, Sanghaya being the name of the clan to which the Om Namo, Namo, Namo Buddha (born Siddhārtha Gautama) Shakyamuni belonged. Buddha = Awakened One Dhamma = Teachings, or the way things truly are Sangha = Spiritual Community om maitri mahāmaitri maitriye svāhā Maitri is the Sanskrit word for friendly, benevolent, sometimes loving-kindness. The Pali equivalent is metta. Mahamaitri means greatly friendly... This is also the mantra of Maitreya, the Buddha of future time. "gone, gone, gone beyond, gone altogether gate gate pāragate pārasamgate bodhi svāhā beyond, oh what an awakening, All hail!" (Conze trans.) om tāre tuttāre ture svāhā

A typical Tibetan understanding relates each of the six syllables to the six realms of conditioned existence. Avalokiteśvara, Bodhisattva of Compassion, appears in each realm offering what the inhabitants need in order to awaken from that state. The mantra then is seen as activating that quality in the universe which liberates beings in whatever realm they are in.
